The following sample questions & answers can be used to facilitate a game of Jeopardy to check for participants' learning and encourage interaction. Facilitators may substitute or add questions to suit their needs.



Grade 11 Milestones		
\$200	“This is a recommended activity for high school juniors to use their summers wisely”	“What is preparing for or retaking the SAT/ACT?” OR “What is getting a summer job/internship?” OR “What is getting ahead in/making up courses?”
\$400	“A high school counselor can help students get fee waivers for this exam, which is used for college admissions”	“What is the SAT?” OR “What is the ACT?”
\$600	“This refers to when a high school student takes a college course and receives credit from their high school”	“What is Dual Enrollment?”
College Applications 101		
\$200	“The number of CSU or UC campuses that you can apply to for free with a fee waiver”	“What is 4?”
\$400	“This is the deadline for CSU or UC applications”	“What is November 30?”
\$600	“Foster youth who apply to community college early, and who complete 3 simple steps, can receive this benefit”	“What is priority registration?”
Filing for Financial Aid		
\$200	“This \$5,000 grant is exclusively for foster youth”	“What is the Chafee Grant?”
\$400	“This is the priority application period for financial aid”	“What is October 1 through March 2?”
\$600	“If they qualify for this status, a foster youth will not need to supply parent financial information on the FAFSA”	“What is Independent Status?”
College Pathways & Supports		
\$200	“This type of college offers low tuition and an affordable option for a 2-year degree or transfer path to a 4-year university”	“What is community college?”
\$400	“This is a common name for campus support programs that are available at many colleges and universities”	“What is Guardian Scholars?”
\$600	“Youth can find a campus support program on this website”	“What is California College Pathways?”
County Child Welfare Agency Resources		
\$200	“A social worker/ILP Coordinator/Transition Coordinator can help youth obtain this document, which colleges may need to verify foster care status”	“What is a ward of the court letter?”
\$400	“This is a program that can provide funding and support to help youth succeed in college”	“What is the Independent Living Program?”
\$600	“This type of county child welfare agency meeting can be requested by a youth to help identify supports and resources to assist youth with college planning”	“What is a Child and Family Team (CFT) meeting?”
